For more than 150 years, the Catholic health ministry in California has provided compassionate care to our patients, families and communities. We are committed to improving the health and well-being of every person and community we serve. Together, our Catholic and Catholic-affiliated systems operate 51 acute care hospitals, which represent over 16% of all hospitals and nearly 19% of the hospital beds in California.

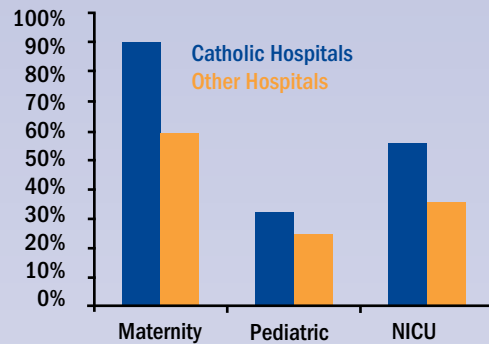
## California Catholic Hospitals Provide Distinctive High Quality Services

Catholic hospitals are committed to serving our communities by providing valuable health services not always available in other hospitals. Services that are more often found in Catholic hospitals include neonatal intensive care units (NICU), pediatric care beds and maternity care.

Catholic hospitals are leaders in the provision of palliative care and pain management, helping improve the quality of life for our seriously ill patients, and their families. Almost 100 percent of our Catholic and affiliated community hospitals operate palliative care programs, compared to a little more than 50 percent of California hospitals as a whole. Hospice is also a major part of our commitment to quality care, providing comfort and support to patients and their families coping with end-of-life issues, extending from supportive nursing and medical care to grief counseling and bereavement services to family and friends.

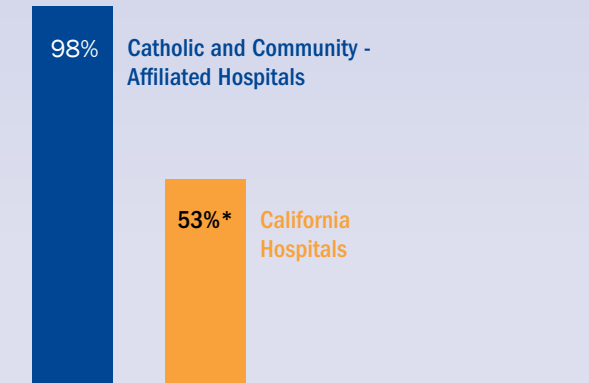
All of our hospitals also offer a “Spiritual Care Program” to provide prayerful support to all patients, respecting the sacredness of life and the dignity of each and every person during their hospital stay. With the support of an interdisciplinary care team, this may also include assistance from specially-trained “No One Dies Alone” volunteers, who provide compassionate support and companionship to dying patients who would otherwise be alone.

## Alliance of Catholic Health Care Mission

The Alliance of Catholic Health Care strengthens the Catholic health care ministry in California by providing a statewide forum in which ministry leaders collaborate on advocacy, ministry leadership formation, Church relationships and other issues that enhance the common good.

### Core Values

**Dignity** – Respect for each person as an inherently valuable member of the human community and as a unique expression of life.

**Justice** – Advocate for systems and structures that are attuned to the needs of the vulnerable and disadvantaged and that strengthen a sense of community among all persons.

**Collaboration** – Achieve public policy goals by working together and with other organizations at the state and national levels that share a similar vision and values.

**Stewardship** – Recognize that the human, financial and ecological resources available for health care are limited and must be managed wisely and efficiently.

### Public Policy Priorities

California's Catholic health care systems and hospitals together advocate on behalf of the following public policy priorities through the Alliance of Catholic Health Care:

#### Serving Those in Need

- Advocate for expanded health insurance coverage and access for all residents of California. Health care is a basic human right.
- Provide leadership on behalf of public policies that promote the health and well-being of communities, with a particular emphasis on the needs of the poor and underserved.

#### Promoting Not-for-Profit Health Care

- Promote and preserve the not-for-profit mission in health care delivery and support efforts to enhance this sector's capacity to serve patients and communities.

#### Strengthening Medicare and Medi-Cal

- Advocate for adequate funding of the Medi-Cal (Medicaid) and Medicare programs.

#### Protecting Religious Freedom

- Preserve the ability of Catholic and other religious organizations to deliver health care consistent with their religious beliefs and values.



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
